Projects on Hand

DAP has various projects on hand which are currently in the finalisation stage.

Sasol - Temane



Works for the Sasol – Temane project included the following furnished prefabricated buildings:

- Accommodation units
- Security offices
- Medical unit
- Laundry
- Kitchen

Civils works included ground works, concrete, paving, fencing, electrical- and water reticulation, and the installation of a boom gate.

DAP also received the following awards for this project:

- HSE Award Recognition for 1 million man hours injury-free
- 2 time winner of the Contractor of the Month Award

Anvil Mining – DRC



DAP supplied a Training Centre and an Office measuring a total of 662m². Works included the installation of 45 air conditioners as well as electrical reticulation.

All materials were exported and transported by road to site.

American Embassy – Kruger National Park SA



Data published by the South African Department of Environmental Affairs (2014) recorded that 1116 rhinos were poached. That is a staggering 3 rhinos per day.

The Sanparks project is an initiative for the “Save the Rhino” campaign. DAP supplied fully furnished accommodation units and a kitchen/diner unit at the Phambeni site.

In addition, two three bedroom houses are being built at the Skukuza airport site. Furniture supplied and installed includes bedroom furniture and linen, dining table, couches, and a fully equipped kitchen with cutlery, gas stove and fridge. Each house measures 64m².
